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
ANEG

- The Airspace and Noise Engagement Group acts as a formal channel of communication between the Department for Transport and airspace and airport noise stakeholders.
- The ANEG covers all aspects of national airspace and airport noise policy development. It acts as a sounding board to identify, discuss and, where possible, resolve airspace and airport noise issues that impact on the work of the department. Discussions are at a strategic policy level.

ROLE OF REGULATOR

- To ensure government policy is delivered effectively
- To provide industry and communities with greater certainty
- To ensure aviation noise is subject review
- To create commercial incentives for the industry to reduce noise

REGULATION EXAMPLE

Aviation Green Paper:

- A new objective to limit, and where possible, reduce total adverse effects on health and quality of life from aviation noise.
- A new national noise indicator to track the long term performance of the aviation sector in reducing noise.

OUTCOME OF REGULATION

The opportunity to grow in exchange for regulation

The industry can pursue growth provided its noise impacts are subject to robust regulation by an expert, independent and empowered regulator

RECOMMENDATION

- Effective regulation is needed before or in parallel with airspace modernisation and airport expansion
