## **Safety Alert**

**Unsecured Loads on Dollies**

## Introduction

There has been a recent trend of incidents involving dollies with unsecured loads, many of which have involved the loss of ULD containers. The total number of dropped container load incidents for 2018 was 17. As of 10 June 2019, 13 have already occured. This is a personal injury risk and has resulted in damage to other vehicles and airport infrastructure.

The purpose of this safety alert is to remind drivers that it is their responsibility to ensure that their load is secure prior to moving off and that a walkaround must be completed, ensuring that all the stops are up. Faulty, damaged or unsafe equipment must not be used and should be red-tagged and reported promptly through your companies' fault reporting procedure.

In any instance where a load is lost from a dolly, this must be reported immediately via '222'. Equipment must not be moved until Airfield Operations have attended and collated necessary information.
